Tinfoil Robots



We all like to bling it up at times and this is an inexpensive way to make your own beautiful creations. Create patterns using glue or a ball point pen then gently press on glued tinfoil to give the metallic look, add it to a necklace or keep as a silver look coin. It's as easy as that.

Stained Glass Tinfoil

Stained glass is always beautiful and colourful and you can make your own stained glass inspired piece with the technique below. Using a similar technique as the pendants, glue is applied to card then covered with tinfoil. Then a mixture of glue (clear drying) and food colouring is added to the segments. These will dry clear and give a beautiful reflective look to the piece.
